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


Online Community and Economic **Development Programs**

The quality of life in communities around the world depends on well-trained, educated leaders and professionals who understand the theory and practice of community and economic development (CEDEV). Professionals in CEDEV work to build stronger, more viable, sustainable communities by understanding a broad range of issues, including community processes and structure, leadership, land use, population changes, municipal finance, and economic development.

Penn State's online CEDEV programs help you to develop the knowledge and skills to work with community members to identify and address community needs and opportunities, allowing you to better navigate the complexities of communities

and community organizations. You can learn to balance theory and its practical application to real-life opportunities and challenges faced by communities around the globe. The curriculum will help you develop critical thinking about issues such as:

- effective decision making in communities
- evaluating causes and consequences of economic and population change
- job creation, retention and expansion, and entrepreneurship
- citizen engagement and participation
- land use and sustainable development
- community structure and processes that affect development and well-being

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Graduate Certificate in Community and Economic Development

The graduate certificate in CEDEV requires you to successfully complete 15 credits (five courses), and introduces concepts and practical strategies that are useful, whether you are new to the profession or have experience working with community- or development-related institutions. The program can also meet your needs if you are considering a career in community and economic development and want to find out if this profession is right for you.

Required Curriculum

- CEDEV 430—Principles of Local Economic Development
- CEDEV 452—Community Structure, Processes, and Capacity
- CEDEV 500—Community and Economic Development: Theory and Practice
- CEDEV 509—Population, Land Use, and Municipal Finance
- CEDEV 575—Methods and Techniques for Community and Economic Development

Our curriculum is designed to help you reach your academic and professional goals by achieving important milestones. The graduate certificate in CEDEV is an excellent standalone credential. Or, you can apply the 15 credits you earn in the certificate to the Master of Professional Studies in CEDEV. You must apply separately to the certificate and master's degree programs.

Master of Professional Studies in Community and Economic Development

The Master of Professional Studies (MPS) in CEDEV is a 30-credit program (10 courses) that enables you to balance your family and professional commitments while achieving your educational goals.

The interdisciplinary curriculum is designed to give you the skills to:

- · recognize community needs and opportunities
- work with residents and leaders to assess communities and regions and to implement change
- understand and increase effectiveness of the structures and processes of communities and community organizations to achieve community or organizational goals
- · identify and implement economic development opportunities

Students say that course work in the MPS in CEDEV has immediate application to their career, elected office, or volunteer activities, helping them make their communities stronger, more sustainable, and better places to live and work.

In addition to the five core courses from the CEDEV graduate certificate, you will further enhance your education in the MPS by taking the following courses:

- CEDEV 505—Leadership Development
- CEDEV 580—Community and Economic Development Research Application and Practice
- STAT 500 or STAT 800—Applied Statistics
- **Electives**—You will choose an additional 6 credits of elective courses in consultation with your MPS program faculty adviser.

Begin Your Application Today

Admissions decisions for the CEDEV program are based on the quality of your credentials and statement of interest. A committee of CEDEV faculty makes the decision following a thorough review of your completed application portfolio.

For the MPS program, your application portfolio must include:

- online application form and fee
- statement of purpose/goal statement
- three references
- résumé or vitae
- TOEFL or IELTS score, if applicable
- transcripts from each postsecondary institution attended

For the graduate certificate program, you will need to submit:

- online application form and fee
- current résumé
- short statement of interest
- TOEFL or IELTS score, if applicable
- transcripts from each postsecondary institution attended

- > Graduates of this program include a community development block grant administrator, researcher in public utilities, mortgage analyst for a major bank, senior planner, volunteer manager in a nonprofit organization, economic development specialist, and Peace Corps volunteer.
- ➤ An optional Summer Institute gives you an opportunity to meet faculty, participating students and alumni of the program, and other community development professionals face-to-face.
