Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction

Penn State World Campus and the Penn State College of Education have partnered to offer a 30-credit online Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Curriculum and Instruction with course work that's personalized and applicable to your career. Whether you seek depth in a single area or choose an interdisciplinary approach, you will work closely with a faculty adviser to choose from courses in a variety of disciplines to customize a plan of study that makes sense for you. This M.Ed. features the same curriculum as our prestigious, high-quality residential program, taught largely by the same faculty. The program requires a master's inquiry project (paper, portfolio, or children's book) through which you can connect course content to your professional goals. While the course work is asynchronous and the curriculum is personalized, learning happens in a community with your instructors and peers. Much of the course work is completed in collaboration with others through discussion boards and group projects.



A Program Designed to Prepare Educators to Make an Impact

The M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction is designed for K–12 teachers as well as a wide range of education professionals, including curriculum specialists, paraprofessionals, librarians, out-of-school educators, and more. It is ideal for education professionals who are seeking professional learning opportunities related to curriculum, teaching, learning, and educational supervision. This online program can equip you to meet the challenges of education in diverse and ever-changing social, cultural, political, economic, and physical environments.

While this program is not designed to lead to initial teacher certification in any state, it may help you renew or maintain your existing certification if you are already a certified teacher. You are encouraged to check with your state's Department of Education for renewal and maintenance requirements.

Program Requirements

The M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction is structured around these requirements.

Core Course Work (12 credits)

- 3-credit core colloquium (first course)
- 9 additional credits of core courses learning, curriculum, research

Personalized Course Work (18 credits)

>15 credits with a personalized focus

Personalize your course work by focusing on one disciplinary area or select courses across multiple areas. Choose from a variety of disciplines, including children's literature, curriculum and supervision, elementary education, English language arts, multilingual education, social studies, and STEM education. 3 credits of an additional approved elective

There is a children's literature path for students seeking to specialize in literature for children and adolescents. This path requires you to take LLED 568: Doing Research in Children's Literature as a core course and LLED 502: Studies in Literature for Children as a personalized course selection.

In this online M.Ed. program, you can:

 explore how to design, evaluate, and apply curriculum resources and provide curriculum leadership in your school and/or district

- > cultivate an inquiry stance by studying your own practice as you apply new pedagogical approaches designed to benefit learners and making responsive adjustments to curriculum, instruction, and/or assessment
- enhance your understanding of the challenges facing education today and the significant role of education in schools and society
- gain a deeper understanding of how to equitably support learners' sense-making within and across content areas
- learn how to bridge research and practice through independent research mentored by top faculty in the field


