Master of Education in Educational Leadership

Penn State's 30-credit online M.Ed. in Educational Leadership program is designed to prepare you to be an effective 21st-century teacher and school leader. The mission of the program is to produce outstanding leaders who are committed to continual improvement in education, who believe higher levels of learning are possible for all students, and who are committed to the ideals of equity, inclusivity, and social justice.

As a student in this program, you can learn to analyze data and apply peer-reviewed research when making informed decisions about instruction. You can also develop skills to cultivate relationships and enhance school culture for improving student learning outcomes and organizational effectiveness.

In this program, you can choose from three options: Teacher Leader, School Leader with Principal Certification, and School Leader without Principal Certification. You can also opt to complete a Graduate Certificate for Principalship.

Teacher Leader

Recent research underscores the need for school leaders to rely on teachers to help lead a school. Our Teacher Leader emphasis area provides you with the knowledge and skills to make the transition from classroom teacher to "teacher leader." In this curriculum, your perspective will evolve from a classroom view to a whole-school view of people, programs, and administration. Our Teacher Leader graduates often seek leadership opportunities such as grade-level teacher leader, team leader, or department head.

School Leader with Principal Certification

Created for students who are interested in school leadership and have career plans to become a building principal in Pennsylvania, this emphasis area includes Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE)—approved course work leading toward principal certification. A yearlong internship in a real-world setting under the supervision of accomplished administrators serves as the final (capstone) course work in this program.

School Leader without Principal Certification

Students interested in school leadership but who have no career plans to become certified as a building principal can choose this emphasis that does not include Pennsylvania principal certification. Most students in this option are not residents of Pennsylvania. In place of a yearlong internship, students participate in a modified internship for one semester as the final 3-credit (capstone) course. During the modified internship, students work with a building administrator in a school setting to develop leadership knowledge and skills. Students will also complete a reflection paper.

Graduate Certificate for Principalship

This 18-credit online certificate can help you acquire the credentials to become a certified Pennsylvania school principal or administrator. The program complies with current requirements of the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation, the National Educational Leadership Preparation Program, the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education, and the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Our faculty have field-based experience in both the public and private sectors. If you reside outside of Pennsylvania, please consult with

your state department of education about reciprocity prior to submitting an application to this program.

Admissions decisions for the Master of Education in Educational Leadership and the Graduate Certificate for Principalship are based on the quality of your complete application portfolio.

Your application portfolio must include:

- > online graduate application and fee
- official transcripts from each institution attended
- successful undergraduate record with a minimum GPA of 3.0
- > three letters of recommendation
- > statement of purpose
- résumé
- > writing sample
- > TOEFL or IELTS scores, if applicable
