

Bachelor of Science in Political Science

The online 123-credit International Politics major provides you with a comprehensive education in international politics, with options to concentrate in international relations, international political economy, and national security studies. Through course work in international and comparative politics, as well as in economics, geography, and history, you will examine various contemporary issues, such as ethnic conflict, terrorism, global violence, and economic and political globalization. How much is tuition?

Tuition is based on cost-per-credit as is associated with your program of study. Tuition rates are assessed every semester of enrollment. During your course of study, you may incur additional charges, such as credit-by-examination, exam proctor, and transcript fees. Please visit our website for the most up-to-date tuition rate.

Does Penn State World Campus offer financial aid?

World Campus makes many options available to help you pay for your education. Full- and part-time degree-seeking students are eligible for federal student aid. We also have flexible payment options to help you, including deferred payment plans, third-party payments for employed professionals, and military payment options.

What does the online classroom look like?

Our philosophy for designing online courses: Use the latest technology to best deliver the content in the most flexible way while keeping the technology transparent to you.

We use one centralized platform where you can log in to your classroom. From there you can get assignments, interact with faculty and peers, participate in message boards, and more.

How long will it take me to finish my program?

This answer varies for each student. There are many factors (e.g., transfer credits, course load per semester) that influence how long it will take. Depending on the program, some students are able to complete 12 credits every year—others more than 20 credits. You will work closely with an adviser to determine the best course of action for you to complete the program.

Deadlines

Your degree application, including all transcripts, must be received by the following deadlines to be considered complete:

- June 30 for fall semester admission
- October 31 for spring semester admission
- March 15 for summer semester admission
