The online Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Higher Education is a 30-credit program designed to provide you with the solid foundation of knowledge you need to pursue a career and leadership in postsecondary education. Online Graduate Certificate in Institutional Research

The program includes topics such as research design, assessment, and evaluation, enrollment management, and the integration of strategic planning with institutional finance.

The M.Ed. in Higher Education curriculum allows you to choose from the following emphases:

- Administration—if you want to pursue a career or career advancement in a wide variety of administrative and staff support areas in colleges and universities
- Student Engagement—if you want to work in areas specifically related to students in colleges and universities
- Institutional Research—if you seek a career in data analysis and research within colleges and universities
- Fundraising Leadership—if you are interested in philanthropy and donor relations in a collegiate setting

Each area of professional practice is designed to provide the scholarly course work and practical experiences that you need to qualify for an entry-level professional staff position and career advancement in fields of higher education.

Upon your completion of this program, you should be able to:

- critically evaluate higher education as a field of study, appreciating its history, diversity, and global context
- utilize research and data to effectively assess current challenges facing higher education institutions
- skillfully address audience, purpose, and context in professional and scholarly communication, and use appropriate writing skills and media in oral presentations
- collaborate with others and use critical self-reflection skills to clarify personal values for leading and decision-making
- > become a lifelong learner in this field
- construct a learning and career portfolio for ongoing professional development and reflective practice

Your application portfolio should include:

- completed graduate school application and fee
- official transcripts from each postsecondary institution attended
- official military transcripts (if applicable)
- official GMAT, GRE, LSAT, or MAT score (Test scores are not required for M.Ed. applicants who have attained three years of full-time experience in higher education, received a master's degree in another field, or acquired the Graduate Certificate in Institutional Research at Penn State.)
